

Poland: War & Resilience

June 14 – Travel Day

Depart the US on an overnight flight to Warsaw, Poland.

June 15 – Arrival in Warsaw

Arrive in Warsaw and begin your journey in Poland's capital, where WWII history runs deep. After settling in, take a walking tour of the reconstructed Old Town - a symbol of resilience - followed by a visit to the Warsaw Uprising Museum.

June 16 – Warsaw: Ghetto & Memorials

Visit key sites tied to the Holocaust and Jewish history: the POLIN Museum of the History of Polish Jews, the Ghetto Heroes Monument, and remnants of the Warsaw Ghetto Wall. In the afternoon, spend time in Łazienki Park or enjoy a peaceful café in the restored city center.

Overnight: Warsaw

June 17 – Lublin & Majdanek

Travel southeast to **Lublin**, a charming city with a haunting past. Visit the Majdanek concentration camp - less altered than other sites, it serves as a raw and powerful memorial. Afterwards, explore Lublin's picturesque Old Town, rich with centuries of Jewish and Polish history.

Overnight: Lublin

June 18 – Kraków Arrival & Schindler's Legacy

Travel to Kraków. Visit Oskar Schindler's Enamel Factory, a powerful museum that tells the story of Kraków under Nazi occupation. End the day with a peaceful evening stroll through Kraków's Old Town, a UNESCO World Heritage site.

Overnight: Kraków

June 19 – Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial

Spend the day at the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial and Museum. This will be a solemn and guided experience, honoring the memory of the millions who perished. Return to Kraków in the evening for a quiet group dinner and reflection.

Overnight: Kraków

June 20 – Departure

Some travelers may depart from Kraków; for those guests, we'll offer an early morning airport transfer before the rest of the group travels back to Warsaw for afternoon departures.

Note:

All museum and memorial entry fees outlined in the itinerary are included in the trip cost. This includes a guided tour of the Auschwitz-Birkenau Memorial and Museum.
